**Wells Fargo Awards \$50,000 to CalAsian Chamber of Commerce for  
Economic Development Program, EMPOWER**

These funds will support the EMPOWER program, focusing on bolstering workforce development programs in low-to-moderate incomes areas of California’s South San Joaquin Valley.

EMPOWER, is focused on reducing the chronic long-term unemployment rate within the Fresno Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) through an innovative job skills and contractor procurement training program for the regional labor pool leveraging California’s High Speed Rail Authority’s construction of a maintenance facility in the Central Valley.
